Thematic areas of intervention

The focal point of SAMIDA is in the fronts of health, education, economic and social up-lift of deprived and augmenting the income generation and capacity building programs for sustainable livelihoods, designing agrarian models, disaster preparedness, and environment protection and fostering climate change. A special attention is in place to safeguard and protect the women and children from ill-effects of changing scenarios of expansion of urban neighborhood, expanding slums and deteriorating family structures, Development and expansion of cooperative movement by fostering the CBO's, SHG and MACS institutions especially with the marginalized and peasants, women farmers and vegetable growers, daily wage earners and initiating them into thrift and savings.

SAMIDA implements several community development programs, which are centered on the thrift and credit, household micro enterprises, farmers and women cooperatives and on right of the communities. This provides them a platform. Planning takes place in a participatory manner. All the staff members involve in the planning process and Secretary provides required guidance during the planning meetings. SAMIDA plays an extensive Media Advocacy and outreach on Tribal Children Rights and leverages in accessing the rights as per sub plans and legislations and organizes the Care & protection services to PWD, HIV infected & affected, nutrition services towards providing better health, societal harmony, child welfare, well-being and rights education for all associated with us and along with it the youth/women/Adolescent/child advancement and empowerment, gender rights.

Key objectives

- The objective is organizing vulnerable communities into organized groups and institutions which would act as leveraging source of linkages and establish the Support & nurture to mobilize resources and enable them as sustainable entities.
- Formulate sustainable models in vocational and occupational preparedness, income

generation and promoting human resources and advocate for replication and scale up.

- Enable the communities to devise the linkages and accesses during distress and during the times of calamities and negotiate with different agencies for strengthening the community efforts
- Promotion of Community based organizations like-Self Help Groups (SHGs) for savings, and accessing micro credit for micro enterprise and entrepreneurship development and federation of such SHGs into MACS cooperatives
- Formation of Small Farmer Producer Organizations (SFPOs) for different agriculture commodities
- Promotion of cooperatives/business enterprises among artisans of various products
- Promotion of community health projects namely child nutrition, maternal care, disability welfare, sanitation, personal health and hygiene, HIV/AIDS prevention, cure, support services

1. Skilling Community owned Promotion & Enhancement (SCOPE) model Skill Trainings to the Tribal School Dropout Youth, Ananthageri mandal Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh, with the support of the Functional Vocational Training and Research Society (FVTRS) Bangalore

“Every nook and corner of the globe is aware of these inherent strengths of entrepreneurship towards spurring economic advantages. India has taken up some major leads in pitching entrepreneurship as the cure-all, and amidst this, all contributions towards unfurling the powers of this discipline have got to be paced up towards a vibrant social institution building which is laudable”.

With just 4.69% of available skill base in India there is a widespread skill requirement in this region of fast growing industrialized city and here where our efforts have been concentrated. Proportionate to the India’s vision of Kaushal Bharat to reach out to the unemployed youth of this area and including all the segments to mainstream them into the livelihoods mission and thereby on providing intuition and articulation to identified youth through SCOPE exercises to build and enhance their livelihoods. Skill development and developing pool of trained youth readying them for occupation enhancement without resorting to the migrations has been underway through this project for sustainable livelihood training the youth in skill trades and making the resource as applicable to churning out the living has been a marked feature of this project principal outcome and the intervening cross cuttings are education, enhanced open schooling, increased technical learning’s in advanced institutions and certifications are all the major focus areas of this project.

The organization SAMIDA has been implementing the program for the tribal school dropout youth under SCOPE model skill development trainings to the tribal youth for their livelihoods

enhancement and sustainable livelihoods creation. Under this program this year we have been covered the following trades identified in the village level through the village level skill development committee.

The skill development committee was undertaken the entire process in the village level and they have to maintain the skill training centers in the village level. They closely observe the trainees mind set and they made suggestions to the trainees as well as the vocational teachers who are in the master trainee in the trade wise and center wise.

Major outcomes SCOPE project as have been Already Reflects in:

- Application of skill and entrepreneurship based developments in small businesses and undertaken with the inputs given during the EDP programs
- Human Resource Development which is reflected in enhanced competencies of potential/existing entrepreneurs, ensured through innovation / skill enhancement / capacity building programs
- Increased incidence of New Enterprise Creation through entrepreneurship development programs
- Positive socio economic and environmental impact on account of jobs generated, wealth created and eco-friendly technologies adopted.
- Social change is conspicuous with the economic environment becoming upbeat and problem of migration becoming less intense.
- Decreased gender balance in the entrepreneurship models and thereby the aspiring girls getting a fair chance to deliver the goods and services
- Larger outreach to the adjoining areas enterprises through liaison for increased outreach and job/self-employment model creation

Under this process we have been organized the skill development plan preparation for the selected grama panchayaths (Clusters) in the target area. Based on the output of the skill development plan meetings we have prepared a details action plan for the trade wise skill trainings in the selected clusters.

➤ ***Enterpreneur Development Program***

We have been oriented to the trainees along with the skill trainings. The EDP & Life skill trainings which has given impetus to the functional partnership of FVTRS and the SAMIDA has commenced that has instilled the much needed social relations aspects and is a boon to the dropouts on the contemporary issues of embedding with social issues and adjustment aspects. With a commitment to impart social skills based employability trainings and towards institution building these have started at selected place with chosen topics through experienced resource persons and in this mission hereby the EDP is commenced at venue.

Creates a ‘safe’ environment, in which all staff members are treated equally and fairly, and in which they can perform to the best of their abilities. Understands and acting on the need of staff to be informed about issues that affect them personally and that affect the work unit. Conducts effective meetings and exhibits constructive communication outside the organizational unit. Communicate the reasoning for a decision. Demonstrate the ability to make difficult and/or sensitive decisions. Take decisions in a timely manner.

2. RTP-AHF India Cares (Community based Rapid HIV Testing Program with the support by the Aids Health Care Foundation- India Cares.

“The Strategic partnership plan of AHF and SAMIDA guides the organization’s testing and CBT initiatives to ensure the testing cascade is up and comprehension of set agenda. Towards this parity, that orchestrates the outreach to the diverse and most disadvantaged engages the organizations efforts for translating goal realization by 2020 and by 2032 into action oriented cataloguing. Hence the following annual report recapitulates the parameters through which the testing scenario is drastically transformed to reach out to the far off villages and most shyly populace to the embrace of solace and confidence building and how it contributed to HIV and AIDS in 2017 and reviews the impact of these accomplishments”

Overview of the RTP program

The year 2017-18 represented a transition in many ways for the response. The positive developments have been recorded and significant shift in the attitudes of the people have been recorded through coordinated action strategies and the innovative simple means to accelerate the testing algorithms have bearing on this scenario and 17371 tests were completed and 257 cases (positives) have been recorded though a little more than the targets, yet when the sensitivity is pouring in the efforts have been put in the right direction to record and link them to the nearest facilities. 237 People have availed the linkages out of total tested of 17371 which corresponds to little more than 25% to 30% of the people tested. These achievements are remarkable by any standard. But the urgency and need to do more, and more quickly, is clear when other critical epidemiological trends are considered

3. Target intervention project for high risk group community (female sex workers and also MSM) supported By the APSACS- Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh

Enhanced scope and ambit with the introduction of the present migrant strategy of including focus on source districts to Destinations the system could well be maintained as the Program for Cooperative Cataloguing in which the Potential HRG, returnee HRG, spouses of HRG mainly women and stakeholders are covered through Providing information, linkages to services for HRG and their partners at source, Strengthen linkages, Improving access to other social and development agencies and programmes to reduce vulnerability among targeted community, deep

sea fisheries, stone quarries, brick kilns, Laborers Spread out across the City like Construction, Hotel Services, domestic work etc.

The High Risk Behavior ranging from consumption of drugs & alcohol high risk heterosexual and plural sexual relationships and lack of awareness, knowledge and safe sexual behaviors relating to STI/STD/RTI will make their reasons associated for the project operation. 2-4 times more number of HRG has non-regular partners or visit sex workers, and the prevalence consistently is more than one percent.

The outreach planning for the ORC for the current year worked out and the PE wise planning is being devised with the given parameters of enrolment registers, regular meeting and follow up of the HRG, identification of high risk and vulnerable zones, HRG master sheets with individual details and typology Etc. This apart the organization has pinned a large portion of the hope on the individualized involvement of the peers in accelerating the pace of the program. The peer education (PE) is routed through the VPL and multi-faceted component and its future plans are to extend the outreach so as to make the peer education to per grouping enabled.

The challenges are Coverage, Care and Support, Stigma and Discrimination, Enabling Environment and to counter all these proper strategies applied are scaling up and monitoring quality of Coverage, strengthening Enabling Environment, Enhancing access to services for Care, Support and Treatment, Strengthening the services under STI Management, Increased awareness and widespread communication strategies and bringing focus on Mainstreaming activities.

➤ *In this project we have organised the some of the events by the guidance of the APSACS & NACO with the support of Project officer -TSU & DAPCU-team.*

The HRG groups got to be stimulated towards a paced up testing agendas Attitude of infected on safety measures and prevention tactics has to be taught. The target audience has not been getting comprehensive coverage of all components apart from the stipulated sectors as a result of the outreach and the low quality of interactions which is targeted. The scant regarded audience is not inclined and not steadfast in their approach and not coming open in obtaining services which is planned to be rectified.

Further changes in the population of the target group are not visible excepting that almost all are not getting tested and confidence and composure are not apparent as a result of ill treatments and non - increase in knowledge and awareness levels. In the line of order the participation level of the stakeholders like family, peers, siblings etc. is not very promising and knowledge levels are not grading as well as not inducting other neighbors is apparent in the project areas of Visakhapatnam of Andhra Pradesh. The amazing aspect is that the information as to the treatment is not being made available and the multiplicity of the likelihoods are surfacing to link up to the likelihood of spread.

Attitude of infected community on positive behavior is not showing up the results In-house orientation on attitudinal aspects are not pacing up to the demand for personalized attention on the grass root functionaries and the community has failing to identify the progress of the inputs in relation to the collaboration of government line department functionaries. Utilization of the staff for conducting treatment intervention, treatment outlets etc. are not being devised and communications channels passing through many stumbling blocks like limited human resource as compared to the area to be covered while ensuring the participation of the secondary stakeholders and in this respect the peer education has not recorded positive gains. An added dimension has been the identification of possible healthy partners to the HIV infected so that a comprehensive strategy could be evolved.

- Behavior change communication, an approach that involved behavioral sciences, social learning, and persuasion to achieve realistic targets is the requisite.
- Emphasizes on audience involvement and participation throughout the Testing process is needed Etc.
- Recognized that behavior change is much a societal process as it is an individual decision making process supported by the circles and family.
- Appreciation of the crucial role of environment, involvement of stakeholders and peer/sibling involvement is required to capture attention, interest and most importantly emotions to make learning and change a pleasurable experience.

➤ **The SAMIDA has conducted the World Aids Day Event.**

Introduction: World Aids Day event is organized in Narsipatnam, Nakkapalli and Madivada (Ravikamatham Mandal) in Visakhapatnam District in which conducted the public meeting and rally at Narsipatnam, Nakkapalli and Madivada with the college students and SHG women, Youth and also Target community of the TI project and local area hospitals staff (medical department) and our organisation staff and volunteers. The meetings have focused on creating awareness on preventing the HIV/AIDs and how to reduce the HIV infections and also the support services of the government.

Theme of the Event: "MY HEALTH # MY RIGHT"

In the occasion of the World Aids Day, December 1st 2017 SAMIDA has conducted the awareness rally with the community members and school children in Narsipatnam areas. Dr. Sudha Sarada (Superintendent of area Hospital, Narsipatnam), Dr.H.V.Dora (RMO) of Area hospital participated in the event and inaugurated the rally at the Government Hospital Narsipatnam and In the occasion the Government Hospital staff, Doctors, Print and electronic Media, Local NGOs and other officials were participated in the meeting and disseminated about modes of HIV infections to the community. In the event SAMIDA Targeted intervention staff members distributed IEC materials to all the participants. And conducted One-One sessions, one to Group sessions with the community.





The Project Director Sri D.Veerabhadrarao of SAMIDA-NGO and Project Manager R.Krishna participated in the event and disseminated about the activities conducted by the SAMIDA-NGO. And he also revealed about that the SAMIDA providing the nutrition support to the People Living with HIV/AIDS. SAMIDA was donates the nutrition like rice, daal, oil, bed-sheets to the PLHAs of our target Mandals. Project Today we have conducted 2 rally's and Human Chains at Narsipatnam and Nakkapally areas on World Aids Day event.

4. Street to School (Children Sponsorship) Care & Share Italy

➤ Student Sponsorship Programme (Financial Support for Education)

The cost of living is skyrocketing and the standard of living for the below poverty line masses is going down and people living in the slums are daily wage workers struggle to feed their families and educating the children is a mire. Municipal schools lack minimum facilities and children are left to themselves without supervision lead to low enrolment and high dropout rates. Under this Street to School Program we intend to support the education of children in the slum areas of Vijayawada city for their better academic performance

➤ **Our services under Student Sponsorship Program:**

- The students would be helped with admissions in to educational institutions.
- The students would be provided school and college fee, books, book bags and uniform.
- Our local staff will be in regular contact with the student and his family.
- We will be in regular contact with the educational institutions where our students study to monitor educational performance of our sponsored students.
- The children would be given career guidance classes.
- The children would be encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities of the schools.
- The Student Sponsorship Programme focuses on the education and care of poor and destitute children and of low income families. The sponsorship fee is utilized for school fees, hostel fees, books, uniform, clothes and medical expenses.

Student Sponsorship Programme (SSP) is mainly about identifying high potential young people from disadvantaged backgrounds and circumstances and affording them the opportunity to realize their potential in educational. We also admit children in boarding homes and colleges where there is no possibility for them to remain at home and continue their studies.

➤ **Geographical coverage of the organization**

Sanga Mithra Development association (SAMIDA) is a development support organization working for the poor and disadvantaged people to working in Vijayawada, Machilipatnam, Nuzvid, Agiripalli, Musunuru, Chatrai, Visannapeta, Konduru, Thiruvuru, Visakhapatnam and also at Vijayanagaram & East Godavari Districts of A.P. The extended areas of the operations include East and West Godavari districts. But our main beneficiaries are situated in the districts of Krishna and Guntur.

SAMIDA believes that the main reason as to why poverty still exists in our country in spite the fact that millions of people donate to NGOs is because poor are not empowered through education. We at SAMIDA also believes that the only way to ensure a better future for underprivileged children is by providing them quality education and helping them get admitted to schools and colleges by changing the mindset of their parents.

According to Indian Government reports, around 60 million children between 5-15 years do not attend school. Either they are not enrolled by parents due to lack of money or they are enrolled in government schools but drop out because they have to earn for their family. SAMIDA started with the non-formal education of handful of children in a slum and has today touched the lives of more than 1250 people from different age, social and financial backgrounds.



➤ **Promotion of the Vocational Education & Community development**

SAMIDA provides a platform for vocational training to those students who show a lack of interest in formal studies or were dropouts from school. There is lot of unemployment due to most of the students opting for general subjects. Even after long of years of study and spending lot of money, the students do not acquire any specific skills. As a result, they do not find employment and again depend on their families for maintenance. But we at SAMIDA want the students to become financially independent and support their families. Hence we give importance to vocational education and training.





➤ **Students Career Counselling**

Career counselling is a process that helps the students to know and understand themselves and the world of work in order to make educational, career and life decisions. There are a number of factors like interests, abilities, values, personality, background, and circumstances that influence career development. Present day students are under great stress due to several factors like low family income to support their studies, lack of proper facilities at home to study, lack of proper facilities in the schools, lack of trained and interested teachers, competition among the students for ranks, lack of a specific goal in life. Majority of the students do not know what subjects they should study and what career they should pursue. This situation of the students calls for student career counselling. If the stressful state of the students is not properly addressed, it will have negative impact on their academic performance and their future life.



➤ **Communication between Children & their Sponsors**

To improve their advocacy work regarding democratic rules, transparency and openness we at SAMIDA always ensure to have proper and direct communication between the sponsor and the child under STUDENT SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMME. This is an activity aimed at keeping the sponsors informed about the well-being of their Children like about their studies, Health, Needs

and also a way to keep in touch with each other. This activity contains writing of two letters per each academic year from the child to sponsor. First Letter is generally written in the period of March to August and Second Letter is written during the period between Octobers to January.



5. Tribal Model school construction – Care & Share Italy

The model school construction at village Dekkapuram has been a step- forward venture in the Tribal Development Scenario and an eye opener to several of the development players that are as of now positioned in the Tribal development sector in these areas. As part of the local area education and sustenance development initiatives for continued education and children empowerment proportionate to the contemporary standards through promoting school complex with all the modern amenities and infrastructure is ne initiative. Complementary to this another venture has been the construction of RO plant for safe drinking water, inculcation of drinking water practices, sanitation and hygiene and community management of the water structures by promoting the learning drive as regards the drinking water periphery etc.

SAMIDA have obtained support from the Care & Share Foundation which has been in queue for some period under their approach of “Establishing passage to children is an everlasting imprint on the social transformation and every penny spent will have millions in return”. The Care & Share has impacted several children through sponsorships in the state of AP at Vijayawada and now through this venture the construction initiative in tribal region has escalated and as is evident the present initiative has been the master minded endeavor to empower and show case the best result among the underprivileged sections of the society under local area infrastructure promotion building social capital. The core objectives of the program is

1. Strengthen the participation of youth and communities in building model school and improving quality education/learning
2. Build a model school which provides enabling and creative atmosphere for the tribal children to learn, play and enjoy their childhood



3. Enhance learning levels of children through quality education, extra-curricular and sports activities

6. Safe drinking water project – Care & Share Italy

The RO plant has been initiated by SAMIDA has been an extension of the philanthropy of Care & Share Italia at the Dekkapuram village of Ananthagiri. The idea behind this is that the RO plant is supposed to take care of the water necessities of the surrounding villages along with the school complex and the basic crux lies in meeting the village water needs as also the children studying in the school. In reverse osmosis the meter is cleaning, convert brackish water, clean up wastewater and to recover salts from industrial processes. In the village level of RO plant all contaminants from water which are in dissolved gases, oxygen and carbon dioxide, pesticides, solvents and other organic compounds. In the reverse osmosis process membranes separate purified water from contaminated water and impurities from the concentrated side washed away as in the hill side water will have several of the impurities and will act as an ultra-filter removing particles such as some micro-organisms that may be too large to pass through the pores of the membrane. Improving system performance using specialist RO chemicals is usually avoided as the performance of RO membrane systems, water quality and plant performance can be enhanced with the careful selection and application of advanced treatment material instead of chemicals designed specifically for such water purification facilities and their sensitive membranes.



7. Special programs conducted during the year 2017-2018

1. Anti-Child Labour Day

The anti-child Labour Day was organized by the SAMIDA in the project area. The event was organized with local SHG women and children in the Narsipatnam project office. The meeting was chaired by the project director Sri D.Veerabhadrarao and the vice president Sri S.Sandeep Kumar. Based on the event we have been organized the rally and also awareness camp on the event theme in the Borra Village, Ananthageri mandal.

The program aims to improve the geographical representation of the organization SAMIDA, promote gender parity at professional level, create an enhanced pool of children enriching and diversifying children.

It is an opportunity to join mainstream efforts at the early stage of their career and hundreds of millions of girls and boys throughout are involved in work that deprives them of receiving an adequate education, health, leisure and basic freedoms, violating this way their rights. Of these children, more than half are exposed to the worst forms of child labour.

On this day the SAMIDA has organized the activity of identification of dropouts and never enrolled and the age groups of adolescents are organized to join the bridge courses and organized advocacy with shop owners and other stakeholders to campaign against the incidence of child labour that prevents their orderly growth and progress towards fulfilling their 4 basic rights.

2. Children's day

SAMIDA was organized the children day event at Dekkapuram Village in the Borra grama Panchayath. The chief guest of the event is the Surpanch Smt. D.Sundaramma and the village elders and local youth leaders. The children day is celebrated on 20th of Nov commemorating the birth anniversary of our first Prime Minister Late Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. The United Nations' (UN) Universal Children's Day, which was established in 1954, is celebrated on November 14th each year to promote international togetherness and awareness among children worldwide. Major global variants include a Universal Children's Holiday on 14th November, by United Nations recommendation. In India, Children's Day is celebrated on 14 November, on the birthday of the first Prime Minister of independent India, who was fondly called Chacha Nehru (Uncle Nehru) or Chachaji (Uncle), and who emphasized the importance of giving love and affection to children, to give him tribute. After the death of Jawaharlal Nehru in 1964, it was unanimously decided to celebrate his birthday as BAL Diwas or Children's Day in India. The SAMIDA commemorating the special event has organized the BAL Diwas in the schools of Visakhapatnam Rural district and has organized several of the programs like paintings, essay competitions and to promote happiness of all children and to express gratitude toward mothers and parents.

3. UNCRC Event

We have been organized the event of UNCRC at Dekkapuram Village, Ananthageri mandal. Biologically a child is a human being between the stages of birth and puberty. It refers to a minor, a person younger than the age of majority. Children can be raised by parents, by fosterers, guardians or partially raised in a day care center. Specifically, they have the right to equal protection, which means that every child is entitled to the same treatment at the hands of authority regardless of race, gender, disability, or religion. The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child is a human rights treaty which sets out the civil, political, economic, social, health and cultural rights of children which is ratified in the year 1989 on Nov 20th. It came into force on 2 September 1990, after it was ratified by the required number of nations. It is the most complete statement of children's rights ever produced and is the most widely-ratified international human rights treaty in history. The four core principles of the Convention are non-discrimination, devotion to the best interests of the child, the right to life, survival and development and respect for the views of the child.

Children's rights includes their right to association with both parents, human identity as well as the basic needs for physical protection, food, universal state-paid education, health care, and criminal laws appropriate for the age and development of the child, equal protection of the child's civil rights, and freedom. On this day all the nations celebrate the UNCRC functions including the children gathering, competitions, prize distribution, and school level rallies, elders addressing the children gathering etc.

In the similar lines the SAMIDA has celebrated the occasion with pomp and gaiety marking the special inclination to the children and distributed the prizes. SAMIDA has been systematically working with partners around to fulfill the rights of children particularly within the last five years and currently reaches, supports and empowers children and the work encourages children's ability and participation, and inspires innovation that addresses the barriers children and adolescents with disabilities face in their daily lives. On this occasion the teachers and students are organized to assemble at school premises that have all gathered in large numbers and organized the cultural festivals and distributed the prizes.

4. World AIDS day December 1st of 2017

The SAMIDA organization under the aegis of AHF has organised the WAD -2017 campaign in Visakhapatnam District during 21st November 2017 to 1st December 2017. This campaign has admixed 8 Mandals in the Visakhapatnam District and maneuvered 1000 Free HIV tests and has identified 10 PLHIVs associating with deferent community based organisations like Auto unions, SHG groups, Youth associations and students.

As part of the WAD campaign the SAMIDA has organized the world AIDS day event at all the places of intervention covering all the components and sectors resulting in the Speak out regarding testing, against stigma in which helping out other marginalized communities at risk of HIV infection and not testing. The event is compassionate support and services and engaging beneficiaries and local champions to provide comprehensive HIV services and illuminating risk among persons with disabilities identifying and counselling marginalized young people. On this day the rallies are organized with children, youth, CBO's, group interventions and meetings for AIDS free society. The doctors are involved, RM/PMP, CBO etc. sections are mobilized and massive people gatherings, media sensitization and Providing opportunities to adolescent and young women reducing devaluation because of gender bias, Social isolation, economic disadvantage, discriminatory cultural norms, orphan hood, gender-based violence, and school drop-out all contribute to girls' vulnerability to HIV is the culmination of the event on this Dec 1st 2017.

Community participation

Getting tested which is not happening and being honest and open with one another makes it easier to talk about getting tested and getting on treatment are now open in the treatment retinue with community participation. Now target community is more compassionate in support and services where they're needed most. Through this streamlining the health and well-being of vulnerable

youth and improving their ability to access HIV prevention services through innovative community-based approaches to HIV testing, linkage establishment and resultantly the prevention are sought after. AIDS free society is through combating pediatric HIV and promoting drug adherence. Providing opportunities to adolescent girls and young women in reducing devaluation because of gender bias, Social isolation, economic disadvantage, discriminatory cultural norms, orphan hood, gender-based violence, and school drop-out all contribute to girls' vulnerability to HIV.

5. International Condom Day & Signature campaign

The Condom awareness camp was inaugurated by the Grama Panchayath of Boddavara Smt T.Padmavathi, the venue of the meeting on School Building Boddavara Village. The participants are more than 110 youth and Women were participated the banner March event in the main road and the within the Boddavara village. After that the youth and women are given the slogans to **importance of the condom** and **benefits of the condom usage** and also **use condom protect health**. All the participants are actively in the event.

After completion of the marching event with women & youth, we have been started the signature campaign in the S.Kota RTC bus complex. The signature campaign was inaugurated by the S.Kota Mandal Praja Parishad Chairman Shri Reddy Venkanna Garu and the RTC Bus complex Depo manager Shri B.B.N.K.Raju garu have been participated with his first and second signatures in the signature campaign in the RTC Complex. The chief guest of the program is Mandal Pradesika Member of the Payakaraopeta mandal and local Mother Seva Sangam members and

Head master MPEP School Satyavaram Village and other village elders are participated in the event. After completion of the awareness camp, we have been organized the marching event in village main roads and streets.

The youth and women are given the slogans to **importance of the safe sex practices and usage of condom** and **avoid the unwanted pregnancies benefits of the condom usage** and **save Girl child** also **use condom protects health**. All the participants are actively in the event.



8. General awareness camps

- **Water and sanitation & Safe drinking water**

The water and sanitation are the major chunk of initiatives includes the focused Areas of interventions on risks associated with water, sanitation and hygiene, malnourishment, Government interventions and their response in the area wise dissemination, critical health impacts both technical and operational in general and on pregnant & LM in particular, measures to be adopted by mothers to protect their wards – both conventional, occupational and water borne diseases, assessing nutrition required as benchmark for assessing the effectiveness of the available different water related programs, a valuable input in the campaign for the wider use of nutrition and precautions.

The Overall Objective of the programme is to improve access to safe drinking water, sanitation and hygiene for children, and women in operation villages through community empowerment and strengthening service delivery.

The Specific Results of the programme are

1. Community Participation: Awareness generation on safe drinking water, sanitation and hygiene through IEC campaigns and orientation to Mothers Committee members
2. Enhanced Capacity of village level Workers: Effective and responsive service delivery by Anganwadi Workers.
3. Effective Convergence between line departments and Health: ICDS and Health functionaries work in collaboration to deliver quality services.

- **Child rights awareness**

That the SAMIDA has got a decisive part of organizing the stakeholders in a spin around manifestation to find and look around for the child rights and education front segment and has tacit follow up of the decisive modes of working with Yelamanchilli Mandal stakeholders. Quality of engagement: from an intervention perspective, it is also important that the point of access provides an environment for child rights where the operational regions has the time and inclination to engage in depth with the programme. Line department swelled obstacles: The child rights development work is to be manned suitably since the necessary permissions have to be gotten from the higher ups and their volition is required

In the line of order the participation level of the stakeholders, community level committees, SMC/MC, PRI, line departments in the mainstreaming of child rights is very promising and awareness levels are increasing as well as inducting other players into the program which is apparent with the regular follow up and response of government and all the necessary parameters that are associated with the effective criterion of successful association. Involvement of

community in the process is feasible on account of motivation drive and the interaction with the village stakeholders and intervention with education or government variable impacts.

Wider consultative round table are held with the stakeholders, shop owners who are employing the children and organized the village level networks for support structures, parleys with the revenue, Panchayath and Mandala level institutions. The community level interactions are held during the operation research and validation interactions for enhancing the community level participation, ownership and sensitization.

- **Awareness on RtE**

The right to awareness on entitlements on account of RtE is closely related to the education system is under which is under intense stress with the majority of the children coming from extremely marginalized communities getting affected by barriers, migration and resettlement due to slum and resettlements and thereby the marginalization. There is ever growing demand for entitlements as per the act and here the SAMIDA has a decisive role to play in the unorganized and private sectors schools but adequate awareness is not matching the enactment requirement. It is just and need to generate the awareness and sensitize the communities on the match to the requirement in the communities and matching the set requirements of provision of entitlements. The low capacity is featured with low level of awareness, low investment capabilities, unaware of application of appropriate people organization for entitlements sustainability both in schools as well as in the communities for the participatory research outputs and here the SAMIDA has been playing an important role in providing inputs in the RtE enactment and providing suitable inputs both the education department through round tables and consultations.

- **Awareness on RtI**

The RtI Programme a unique tripartite initiative of the Government of India calling for application of diligence and due observation of the citizens right to observe the social and SAMIDA facilitation in community sectors for Open Innovation and pose challenge to take lead role in obtaining the information and here where supporting the Government of India's missions of right information in the right place enhances the Indian social ecosystem by enabling communities through the stages of ideation, innovation and acceleration, to develop information-based solutions for tomorrow and the organization is a lead role in making the awareness through various round tables, consultations, school level campaigns and unions level of part play is evident and making the initiative more visible and gigantic.

9. External events participation

National Skill Conference at Jaipur- Rajasthan

We have been participated in the event of the National Partners Meet and also National Skill Conference at Jaipur Rajasthan organized by the Functional Vocational Trainings & Research
